City making it easier for you to recycle!

Bridging the Gap and the city are partnering to open a new drop-off recycling center south of I-435.

Residents will be able to take recyclables to the site at 11921 Hardy (behind the fire station at 119th and Lowell) beginning Tuesday, Sept. 18. It is free.

The hours of operation will be from 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday through Friday; 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday; closed on Sunday and Monday.

Items you can recycle at the new site include aluminum foil, steel and aluminum cans, cell phones and pagers, used clothing, corrugated cardboard, glass bottles and jars, small household items, magazines, newspaper, office paper, phone books, plastic bottles and jars, and much more.
